FROM THE TREASURER

Hello to all of the Lake Sherwood Property Owners.

I would like to discuss the donations you make to the lodge and where that money goes. I am talking about the \$100 from each property owner that is asked each year to keep Lake Sherwood Property Owners Association and your lodge going. You receive an invoice late in the year and a reminder mid-year again asking for \$100. Most of you do not donate the \$100 because you dongt feel you get anything for that \$100. Only about 40% of the property owners donate each year.

I would like to say **Thank You** to those who do donate each year to LSPOA. Your donations make a huge difference for many in the community and keep the lodge going every year. Your donations go for the sponsored LSPOA events. The Fisheree in January, the Independence Day Celebration, the Fireworks, and other smaller events and special interests in the community. We offer scholarships for any LSPOA member using your donation dollars. So if your child or grandchild, and even great grandchild, is heading or in college they can apply for a \$1000 scholarship from LSPOA. There are multiple of these and they can be applied for and given out each year your child is in school.

Do you love to snowmobile, and do you belong to a snowmo-

bile club? The Rome Sno-Bandits have over 250 members and maintain 35 miles of trails in Northern Adams County and Southern Wood County. We are deeply committed to serving our community through volunteering, holding community events, and donating to several local charities and organizations. We promote and support our local businesses.

Our club is a member of the Association of Wisconsin Snowmobile Clubs (AWSC). The AWSC is dedicated to the preservation of snowmobiling throughout the state by monitoring regulations and proposed legislation that could affect our sport. They are the legislative voice for Wisconsin's snowmobilers and 600-plus snowmobile clubs statewide. Wisconsin is home to more than 25,000 miles of trails thanks to the efforts of snowmobile clubs with their tireless volunteers.

Our club was recently recognized as õSnowmobile Club of the Yearö at the State, National and International levels. In June of 2021, we submitted an application to AWSC for õClub of the Yearö. This award recognizes clubs that go above and beyond, demonstrated a deep commitment to the sport of snowmobiling, are involved and are striving to make the sport safe and enjoyable for the future. In August of 2021, our club was notified that we were selected. The AWSC then submitted our application to the American Council of Snowmobile Associations (ACSA) to be considered for õClub of the Yearö at the National level. ACSA is a national organization uniting the snowmobile community and promoting snowmobiling as a safe, fun and environmentally friendly family sport. Our club was notified in May of 2022 that we won this prestigious award and would be presented with it at International Snowmobile Congress (ISC) in Dubuque Iowa in June of 2022. While accepting our National Club of the Year Award from ACSA, our club was surprised with being presented with the International Club of the Year and the news that we will be inducted into the International Snowmobile Hall of Fame at a ceremony to be held in Eagle River, WI in September. Our club is very proud of these awards!

Club meetings are held the 2^{nd} Saturday of the month, September through June, at 9:00 am at the Rome Town Hall. There are no meetings in July or August.

Feedback Wanted! The Town is currently reviewing our 2016 Comprehensive Plan, a joint sub-committee of Plan Commission and Community Development Authority (CDA) has been formed. If you would like to participate or provide input, meetings are held the 2nd Tuesday of the month and information is available under Minutes & Agendas on the Town's web site.

Friendly Reminder! The Town's 24/7 hotline phone number is available for any residents experiencing an issue with a Short-term Rental property. The Town contracts with a company named Host Compliance to monitor this hotline.

Please Remember! Pedestrians must walk along the left side of road, when not walking on a sidewalk, and bike on the right side of the road. Bicycles operate under the same laws as other legal vehicles on the road and should always stay on the right side of the road. An easy reminder is FEET ON THE LEFT and WHEELS ON THE RIGHT! And if walking/biking at night or during dusk, wear reflective outdoor clothing or lights to make yourself more visible.

POLICE DEPARTMENT UPDATE by Chief Jason Lauby

In June, the Town Board changed the Town Code that had exempted Lakes Arrowhead, Camelot, and Sherwood from State Law that required Slow No Wake within 100 feet of shore. As a result of this change, motorboats are now restricted to Slow No Wake anytime they travel within 100 feet of the shoreline, on any part of the lakes. Also, as a reminder Lakes Camelot, Sherwood, and Arrowhead are all slow no wake after 8:00 pm. If residents observe boating violations, on a routine basis, we urge them to call the Rome Police Department so we can give these problem areas some extra attention.

PUBLIC WORKS UPDATE by Director of Public Works Brad Martinson

The Splash Pad is now open with regular hours of 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. or dusk, whichever is sooner, seven days a week, through Labor Day Monday. Hours and dates are subject to change without notice depending on weather. Splash Pad use is unsupervised. Use of the Splash Pad or Playground area is at your own risk.

Dyracuse Recreational Area is open Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays through Labor Day. After Labor Days hours decrease, but the park remains open through the last full weekend in October. Friendly reminder, please do not leave trash on the ground at the Town's Transfer Site. Also, if you have a large remodeling/construction project we encourage you to obtain a dumpster, as the Transfer Site is for household garbage, recycling and yard waste/compost. The deadline for electors to register by mail or online is July 20, 2022. In-person absentee voting will begin July 26, 2022, from 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. at the Clerk/Treasurer's Office. In-person absentee voting will end on August 5, 2022 at 4:00 p.m. Absentee ballots may also be requested thru the myvote.wi.gov site. ZONING UPDATE by Zoning Administrator Emily Zeddies

The Town of Rome has a high risk of wildfire. To help reduce the fuel loads prior to wildfires, the Town has proactively enforced the Dead Timber and Brush Ordinance with the cooperation of an intern at no additional cost to the Town. If you received a Dead Timber and Brush Ordinance Enforcement letter, please know the Town wants to work with you in regards to coming into compliance. Please refer to the deadline date provided in your letter and stay in communication with the Town as to clean-up efforts. We appreciate everyone working hard to keep our Town safe in case of wildfire and extend a big 'thank you' to properties who have communicated with us and brought their properties into compliance. Lake Sherwood Covenants and Protective Restrictions Rescission

In December 2020 settlement documents addressing issues in a Notice and Demand letter received by LSPOA from the attorney of an owner of lots in Westwood Shores were approved by Lake Sherwood Property Owner Association Members. This action completed the requirements to accept the settlement documents as set forth in the LSPOA Bylaws. With the acceptance of these documents LSPOA was released of all claims made by the property owner, the LSPOA Covenants and Protective Restrictions were rescinded and no longer will apply to Lake Sherwood and Westwood Shores lots, and any references to covenants and restrictions in the LSPOA Bylaws were eliminated.

Various entities regulate building, setbacks, lot uses, shorelines, shoreline structures, camping, short term rental and much more on Lake Sherwood. The regulations of these entities are similar to many of those contained in the recently rescinded LSPOA Covenants and Protective Restrictions. The Lake Sherwood Property Owners Association intends to support the regulations imposed by these various entities. LSPOA Directors will actively identify activities on Lake Sherwood that impede its purpose to preserve, maintain and improve amenities of the Association, the value of Lake Sherwood property, the water quality of Lake Sherwood and the ability of Members to enjoy their property. Such activities will be reported by LSPOA to the appropriate regulating entity. Lake Sherwood property owners are urged to do the same.

CONSERVATION NEWS

What we do on land is mirrored in the water

As we@re getting into our summer fishing season, try casting near the fish sticks habitat that has been installed on the banks of the two islands in the no-wake Conservancy Area. There are now over 230 trees cabled to the bank, which provide a food source, cover, and spawning areas for our lake. The trees extend about 30 feet out under the water, so stay clear of the trees if you are a swimmer or are in a small hand powered craft, like a kayak or canoe. We

have finished with fish sticks installation on the two islands, but will put in about 30 more trees on the south shore on Adams County property between the weed cutter launch site and the dam in February.

I am working as a volunteer again to assist in implementing the DNR Healthy Lakes grant program this year. You can get a grant reimbursement of up to \$1,000 for installing a rain garden, run-off diversion practice, rock infiltration, native planting, or fish sticks on lakefront parcels. These practices are designed to reduce nutrient and sediment flow into the lake and stabilize shorelines above the waterøs edge. The grant offers a 75% match for funding and you can get credit for your volunteer labor towards your 25% share. You can do more than one project, each with a \$1,000 payment. The deadline for the 2023 grants is November 1st of this year.

It isnot too early to remind folks that as part of the Firewise program, we are planning a 3 hours clean-up of brush and dead trees on Sherwood Forest on the fourth Saturday of October, the 22nd. Bring gloves and an ATV or UTV and trailer to Archers Lane at 9 am to assist. We will have lunch at noon. The Firewise grant will issue a payment for the use of your equipment.

While looking ahead towards fall, curbside brush pick up by the Town of Rome is scheduled for all of the Rome subdivisions, including Sherwood properties. The Town does not plan to send any notification by mail this year, but has plans to post the dates on the Town website and Facebook page.

As part of the Firewise grant program, individual Homeowner Wildfire Risk Reduction projects can now be funded through the 2023 Sherwood Firewise grant. This program was offered twice before as a pilot program but was separate from our Sherwood Forest Firewise grant. We can get funding of up to 7 projects funded up to \$500 with a 50% match. The 50% match can include volunteer labor for your homeownerøs share. The grant process starts with a site visit to evaluate your parceløs risk. Projects included in this grant are screening the underside of a deck to prevent leaf litter accumulation, replacing vinyl gutters with metal, removing dead trees within 100 feet or live trees within 30 feet of a dwelling, covering basement window wells, and converting from wood mulch to rock õmulchö around your house, and replacing vinyl screen with metal. The deadline for this application will be November 1st, same as the Healthy Lakes deadline.

Please contact me if you are interested in participating in the Healthy Lakes grant for improving water quality or the Firewise grant for homeowners to reduce your wildfire risk.

Your volunteer efforts for our Conservation program are a great way to contribute to improving our community. Our work projects and fund raisers serve as an excellent way to meet your neighbors and enhance the lifestyle that brings us to Lake Sherwood. You can volunteer to assist with any of the upcoming Conservation projects or you are also invited to join the LSPOA Conservation Committee. You do not need to be on the LSPOA Board of Directors to be an active committee member. Please contact me if you can get involved.

Tri-Lakes Management District Summer 2022 Newsletter:

Your Tri-Lakes Management District has engaged EOR as our representative Environmental Engineering firm.

They are located in MN with offices in Madison and other areas. www.eorinc.com

They have extensive experience in water management including history with watersheds.

They are currently reviewing our sediment borings from February and the 2000 results and will also be looking at the water testing that have been accumulated over the years in the watershed. They will be our advisors on all facets including the 9 Key Element plan as well as opportunities that may occur due to new technologies or companies that may be able to contribute to improved conditions in our lakes.

To help mitigate e-coli from goose droppings as well as other issues, we conducted our goose roundup on June 22 and collected 94 geese raising our 3 year total to 516. This number of geese would contribute over 3,000 lbs of phosphates and over 10,000 lbs of nitrates to our lakes and shorelines in 1 year! Additionally, their removal greatly reduces the probability of Ecoli contamination as well as other pathogens, viruses and illnesses associated with close contact to geese.

The annual meeting is scheduled for Saturday, September 3, 9:00 am location to be announced.

At this writing we are in the process of attempting to qualify for alum treatments which if, accepted would start next year. Although we have high phosphate content in our sediment borings the continuous flow from the watershed may preclude us from participation in the treatment program. EOR is currently working on this issue. The DNR does issue grants to lakes that qualify for these treatments.

We are also looking at several other companies and programs and have asked EOR to review for possible application within our lakes.

Open burning is defined as burning any material outdoors without any air pollution controls in place. Burning in an unconfined area, a container or a pile are all considered to be open burning.

OPEN BURNING

Burning solid waste materials, such as treated wood, plastic, household garbage and most other trash is prohibited statewide, and local ordinances may be more stringent than statewide requirements. It is legal to burn items such as leaves, brush and clean wood under some circumstances. However, you need to make sure you have all necessary burn permits. Permit can be obtained at Town of Rome located on HWY 13 and Alpine Drive or online at DNR. It is always better to use alternative disposal methods, including composting, recycling, and landfills.
