


Beach Clubs on Lake Sherwood

All off shore Lake Sherwood lots are provided access to the waters of Lake Sherwood in various ways. One of these ways is via subdivision beach clubs. Lots in subdivisions with beach clubs are deeded fractional ownership in such beach clubs. A few beach clubs have organized owners to regulate use of their beach clubs, others have not. Questions regarding beach clubs, such as placing piers, boat hoists, etc. should be directed to these organizations. LSPOA has no jurisdiction over beach clubs. Additional entities may also regulate the beach club shoreline and placement of piers, etc., such as Adams County and DNR. WI real estate law applies to fractional ownership in land. Legal counsel can provide insights into these laws.

Lake Sherwood Covenants and Protective Restrictions Rescission

In December 2020 settlement documents addressing issues in a Notice and Demand letter received by LSPOA from the attorney of an owner of lots in Westwood Shores were approved by Lake Sherwood Property Owner Association Members. This action completed the requirements to accept the settlement documents as set forth in the LSPOA Bylaws. With the acceptance of these documents LSPOA was released of all claims made by the property owner, the LSPOA Covenants and Protective Restrictions were rescinded and no longer will apply to Lake Sherwood and Westwood Shores lots, and any references to covenants and restrictions in the LSPOA Bylaws were eliminated.

Various entities regulate building, setbacks, lot uses, shorelines, shoreline structures, camping, short term rental and much more on Lake Sherwood. The regulations of these entities are similar to many of those contained in the recently rescinded LSPOA Covenants and Protective Restrictions. The Lake Sherwood Property Owners Association intends to support the regulations imposed by these various entities. LSPOA Directors will actively identify activities on Lake Sherwood that impede its purpose to preserve, maintain and improve amenities of the Association, the value of Lake Sherwood property, the water quality of Lake Sherwood and the ability of Members to enjoy their property. Such activities will be reported by LSPOA to the appropriate regulating entity. Lake Sherwood property owners are urged to do the same.

CONSERVATION NEWS

As we're well into our summer fishing season, try casting near the fish sticks habitat that has been installed on the banks of the two islands in the no-wake Conservancy Area. There are now over 230 trees cabled to the bank, which provide a food source, cover, and spawning areas for our lake. The

trees extend about 30 feet out under the water, so stay clear of the trees if you are a swimmer or are in a small hand powered craft, like a kayak or canoe.

Due to inadequate ice last winter, we did not complete our fish sticks project planned for the south shore on the County property from the weed harvester launch site towards the lower Camelot dam. We are hoping to complete that project in January or February of 2024 as it is the last site on public land where we can improve fish habitat.

Each of the Tri-Lakes was represented in the Healthy Lakes grant that was awarded in February to 14 Mile Watershed Alliance. Of the 10 projects being funded, there are 6 on Sherwood, 2 on Arrowhead, and 2 on Camelot. The \$1,000 grant toward each project partially or fully funds native plantings, rain gardens, run-off diversion, rock infiltration or fish sticks installation. If you are interested in this type of project and could use financial assistance, please contact me in the next few weeks, so I have plenty of time to help with your design and grant application that is due by November 1st.

Most of you are aware that Tri-Lakes Management District hired a contractor, Solitude Lake Management, to apply an alum treatment to Lake Sherwood in June. The alum binds with phosphorus in the water column, settles to the lake bottom, and becomes unavailable to feed algae blooms. There will be monitoring of the nutrients and clarity of the lake to assess the impacts and longevity of this treatment in reducing algae growth.

Looking ahead towards fall, we will also be doing our annual Sherwood Forest clean-up on the fourth Saturday of October, the 28th. Please put the date on your calendar and plan to volunteer for our three hour activity followed by lunch. If we get good participation, we can likely start scaling back to doing our clean-up only in odd numbered calendar years. For safety sake, I like to do most of the cutting prior to our clean-up event. If anyone needs oak for home heating or fire pits, please contact me before October to cut what you can use.

Your volunteer efforts for our Conservation program are a great way to contribute to improving our community. Our work projects and fund raisers serve as an excellent way to meet your neighbors and enhance the lifestyle that brings us to Lake Sherwood. You can volunteer to assist with any of the upcoming Conservation projects or you are also invited to join the LSPOA Conservation Committee. You do not need to be on the LSPOA Board of Directors to be an active committee member. Please contact me if you can get involved.

Enjoy the great outdoors this summer with the many activities at Lake Sherwood and in the Town of Rome.



Tri-Lakes Management District Summer 2023

Our Lakes Engineers, EOR, worked with Solitude Lake Management to apply aluminum sulfate, Alum, to Lake Sherwood, June 5 – June 9. Shortly after application there was a noticeable improvement on water clarity as the alum was attracted to phosphates in the water column and sediment. This treatment is expected to reduce the nutrients available for algae growth as we've seen in past years. If this treatment is successful, we will reapply to the WIDNR for grants for the remaining lakes. If we do not receive any grant funding we will discuss options with the electors at the annual meeting scheduled for September 2, 2023. The alum application was applied to the main lake body and Solitude did not apply to the fingers and some bays due to the inability to operate their barge in these tight quarters. They also told us that they do expect the alum to migrate into these areas over time and that the shallow depth of some of these water columns were not deep enough to have much of an impact.

Your Tri-Lakes board has just authorized EOR to conduct other tests to see if we can improve the conditions in the fingers and bays on our lakes which have had issues with stagnant water, low flows and excessive algae. EOR will be installing a Solar Powered Aeration system and a Nano Bubbler. One of these will be tested in a Lake Sherwood Bay and one in the Lake Arrowhead Marina. They will also set up two other locations to test oxygen levels as a base to see if the machines have any effect on the water conditions. If these results are positive we can apply for grants to install these systems in the fingers and bays that have been having the chronic algae issues.

We have also installed a transducer that emits ultrasonic waves out underwater in a bay in Lake Camelot. Here is a synopsis of its efficacy: "UltraSonic algae control uses sound waves at specific vibrational frequencies. Like an opera singer can hit just the right pitch to break a wine glass, the ultrasonic vibrations pass through the water in an all around pattern causing the vacuoles inside the algae cells to resonate and break. It's in this way that the unit actually kills or damages the algae". This machine has been recently identified by a university study to have a very positive impact on algae control. Its cost is minimal so we are eagerly waiting for any results on this test.

Additionally, we are conducting weekly E-coli tests at 12 locations on our 3 lakes and will apprise each Lakes associations of any issues.

We are conducting the DNR's Clean Boats/Clean Waters programs at the 3 county launch sites as well at one additional Lake Camelot location. This program is funded by the WIDNR at the county locations as is a great educational tool for our boaters!

Another important note that we need to share with all of our residents. If you have an aerator or thruster at your shoreline, it <u>must be attached to your pier or boat dock</u>. For any other location without an attachment, you will need to have a permit from the WIDNR. Additionally if you have any unauthorized equipment and it is not flagged with some type of flotation device, you will be responsible for any damage done to any Tri-Lakes harvesters or equipment. You may also be liable for damage to any other property.

Be sure to check out our new website, (trilakesmanagement.com), which is much easier to navigate. We are still loading information such as technologies we are pursuing, and other facts such as reports by the State, other articles as well as real results and progress!

as burning any material outdoors without any air pollution controls in place. Burning in an unconfined area, a container or a pile are all considered to be open burning. Burning solid waste materials, such as treated wood, plastic, household garbage and most other trash is prohibited statewide, and local ordinances may be more stringent than statewide requirements. It is legal to burn items such as leaves, brush and clean wood under some circumstances. However, you need to make sure you have all necessary burn permits. Permit can be obtained at online DNR. It is always better to use alternative disposal methods, Including composting, recycling, and landfills.

No personal watercraft shall be operated at a speed greater than slow-no-wake before 10:00 a.m. or after 8:00 p.m. Water skiing, wake surfing, or being towed on other devices, shall be limited to the daylight hours between 10:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. or sunset whichever comes first.
